Spartanburg Water System Commission Rescinds Drought Proclamation for Landrum
Landrum customers no longer need to voluntarily restrict their use of water resources

SPARTANBURG – At their recent meeting, the Commissioners of Public Works of the City of Spartanburg rescinded the drought proclamation they previously issued for customers in the Spartanburg Water System Landrum Service area.

In the weeks following the issuance of the moderate drought proclamation by the Commission at their November 29 meeting, the Landrum area has received significant precipitation to the point that water supplies have been replenished. On January 11, 2024, the South Carolina Drought Response Committee met and officially declared the entire state as being “drought free.”
