## **Spartanburg Water to Begin First Phase of Otis Boulevard Waterline Project**

*The project will replace the waterline from Palmetto Street to S. Pine Street*

SPARTANBURG – Beginning the week of September 19, Spartanburg Water will begin the first phase of a project to replace the waterlines along Otis Blvd., between Palmetto St. and Pine Street.

As part of Spartanburg Water’s ongoing investment in our drinking water infrastructure, this project will replace aging waterlines, and so reduce instances of line breaks and disruptions to service to those living in this area of the Converse Heights neighborhood.

Construction on the first phase of this project will begin the week of September 19, and end prior to Thanksgiving, dependent on weather impacts.
